Local MRC Puts on Drive Thru Flu Clinic

Drive up, roll your sleeve up, and get your flu shot. This was the case at the 2016 Mercer County Drive Thru Flu Clinic. Deb Sheer, emergency preparedness coordinator at the Mercer County – Celina City Health Department, organized the 7th drive thru flu clinic for the county. "Everything went great," said Sheer following the flu clinic. "The MRC was important to vaccinate everyone who came through."

598 total vaccinations were provided to the community. In addition to the Mercer County MRC, the Mercer County – Celina City Health Department and Mercer County Emergency Response

Volunteers (MCERV) gave their time during the flu clinic. In addition, Sheer created two incident injects to ensure all volunteers were on their toes and knew proper safety protocols; a mock needle stick incident and a mock allergic reaction. "Everyone understood their roles and knew exactly what to do," said Sheer.

FOLLOW UP:

The Toledo-Lucas County Health Department held a small-scale flu clinic testing patient throughput at ProMedica St. Luke's Hospital. The flu clinic was successful and we hope to use this as a model for a large, full-scale LCMRC exercise in 2016.
