Lucas County is struggling with prescription drug use and opioid addiction. This public health crisis requires a collective response.

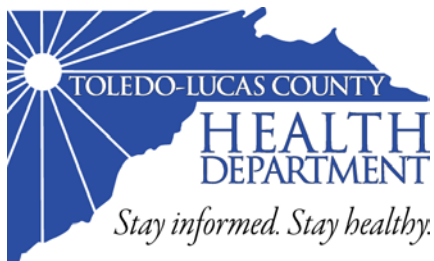
Overdose Prevention Coordinator, Kimberly Toles, with the Toledo-Lucas County Health Department, will be presenting on the opioid epidemic in Lucas County and surrounding areas.

Presentations are appropriate for treatment provider staff, first responders, law enforcement, medical professionals and community members. The training will cover:

- Ohio's opioid epidemic
- Naloxone for opioid overdose reversal
- Signs and Symptoms of an overdose
- Ohio's Good Samaritan Law

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**Things to know:**

- Never use alone
- Fentanyl kills quickly
- Do a tester shot. Don't slam it-try 10-20 cc's first

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**Opiate Abuse:**

- Rapid mood swings
- Lethargy
- Restlessness
- Increased sleep
- Dilated pupils
- Constipation
- Dry mouth and nose
- Itchy skin
- Changes in appetite
- Sexual Dysfunction

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**Recognizing signs of an overdose:**

- The person is unconscious, you cannot wake them.
- Slow, Labored breathing
- Lips or nails are blue
