VII. Medical Director Report - Dr. Daniel Cadigan

Dr. Cadigan reported COVID has been the main focus

VIII. Committee Reports

A) Audit/Finance Report

The Audit/Finance Committee met virtually on Monday, February 22, 2021

Our liability insurance for the agency is currently due. Due to the time frame we will be looking into other providers in the future.

Tina Stokes presented an overview of how purchase are made. Each meeting will have a different topic involving the finances for the agency to help the Board Members better understand how the finance of the health department work.

1. Board Resolution - CDBG Agreement through the City of Toledo

2. Board Resolution - Minority Health Agreement through the Ohio Commission of Minority Health

Board of Health Resolution is required to authorize the Health Commissioner of the Lucas County Regional Health District to apply for, accept and enter into an agreement for the local office of Minority Health through the Ohio Commission of Minority Health in the amount of \$52,500

(Resolution 2021.02.029) A motion was made by Dr. Fernandez and seconded by Dr. Munk to authorize the Health Commissioner to apply for, accept and enter into an agreement for the local office of Minority Health through the Ohio Commission of Minority Health in the amount of \$52,500. 3. Payment of the January 2021 Vouchers

4. Transfer of Appropriations:

A transfer reallocates funds from one cost object to another. Board of Health Resolution is required to approve Transfers of Appropriations performed in the month of January 2021 in the ordinary course of business. Total transfer is \$143,560 consisting of changes in various expense categories.

5. Revenue Estimates and Expense Appropriations:

6. Resolution - 2022 Proposed Budget and Estimated Resources

Board of Health Resolution is required to approve the 2022 Proposed Budget and Estimated Resources. The Proposed Budget gives an estimate of money to be spent and received.

B) Personnel Report - Susan Postal

C) Environmental Health Committee - Donald Murray

The Committee met on Wednesday, February 17, 2021

1. The Environmental Health Committee recommends to support the City of Toledo Healthy Kids Meals Beverages Ordinance.

(Resolution 2021.02.038) A motion was made by Dr. Woodson and seconded by Dr. Munk to approve the variance for the septic system as described above. Motion carried. 12 Yeas, 0 Nays

(Resolution 2021.02.039) A motion was made by Dr. Munk and seconded by Dr. Woodson to approve the Environmental Health Report. Motion carried. 12 Yeas, 0 Nays

X. Prior Business - Eric Zgodzinski

COVID Update

- Have seen a low rate of seasonal flu. The reason could be the use of masks, social distancing, and hand hygiene. There were only 2 hospitalized flu cases as of last week.
- Current COVID numbers: hovering between 30 & 60 per week (averaging about 50).
- Vaccinations: 61,000+ have been vaccinated in Lucas County which is about 15%. This is a community effort with TLCHD and the hospitals and other community partners.
- PODs: we have seen 2000 4000 people coming through our PODs. We have gotten great compliments about our process.
- The amount of vaccine we are getting into our black and brown population with only 5.5% vaccinated, whereas the white population is at 13%. Currently we are working with partners and leaders in our community to get vaccine into the underserved population efficiently and effectively. Twenty percent 20% of our allocation each week will be going into the underserved community to address the inequity of receiving vaccine to this community. Using GIS to pin down where the deficiencies are and how to get into the areas of need.
- Johnson and Johnson will have their vaccine approved very soon with 20 million doses ready.
- As we get additional vaccines we will be able to add more providers; doctor's offices and additional pharmacies. There are 145,000 in the 1B Phase so we are nowhere near having that group vaccinated.
- K-12 staff were vaccinated (9000 people) over two days. Schools are going back to inperson classes.
- Discussion on the various vaccination opportunities we will have in the future with the availability of additional vaccine to include the underserved population.

• We were approached by the city of Toledo to help craft an ordinance to provide healthy beverage options for restaurants. This would be working with the Heart association. This would include 1% milk and 100% fruit juice.

XI. Public Health in the News – Dr. Johnathon Ross

- Kudos to the POD process which is running very smoothly. Use of 211 system is helping those who don't have computer skills for signing up for a vaccine.
- Reading about bring a person (high risk or elderly) you bring in and get your shot too.
- Biggest bottleneck is amount of vaccine available. There is talk of getting more vaccine into the bottles.
- Variants: The UK variant has been found to be more infectious. The current vaccines are doing a good job to prevent serious disease, hospitalization or death. This is also true with J&J tests. Other variants are the African and Brazilian ones. The UK variant has shown up in Michigan which caused the closure of the U of M athletics department.
- A public health issue being focused on in the CHA is Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACES). This looks at the issues of health, behavior, substance abuse and mental health in children who grow up with Adverse Childhood Experiences.
- CDC: Dr. Walensky, the new director of the CDC says traveling is not advised especially with the upcoming Spring Break.
- One Dose issues: Moderna and Pfizer vaccines become effective fairly rapidly, within the second two weeks of having the vaccine. We don't know the durability and effectiveness of just having one dose.
