# iii. Principle Rubric/Evaluation Process

- CHC program shifted to a principles-focused evaluation approach to better reflect the work being done in the community.
- The principles reflect common values, norms, and experiences that describe how the CHC program is implemented across diverse contexts.
- The five principles are: sustainable and equitable investments, self-awareness and empathy, community-led solutions, organizational partnership, and coordinator responsibility.
- CHC coordinator will complete an evaluation rubric with 2-6 partners on 1 CHC objective (AT Plan)
- CHC coordinator will be reaching out to the 2-6 partners in early March to describe the rubric process during a meeting.

- $\circ$  The rubric survey will be open from March 22 to April 15<sup>th</sup>.
- 0 PDA will compile the results and send a report to CHC coordinator in April.
- Results will be shared at our June 1 coalition meeting.

    - AT Plan: Adoption and Implementation
      - Presenting to County Commissioners on March 6<sup>th</sup>
      - City of Maumee passed a resolution for the Active Transportation Plan.
      - Still trying to get a meeting with City Council to present the AT Plan to the Streets Committee before being added to the agenda.
      - Working with steering committee to prioritize the project and program recommendations in the draft plan.
      - Toole Design will be completing renderings and cost estimates on 3 projects
      - Steering Committee meets bi-month. Next meeting in April.
    - Vision Zero
      - City of Toledo contracted with Toole Design Group to facilitate drafting the plan.
      - 0 In the final stages of drafting the plan.
      - $\circ$  Presenting to the City of Toledo's Streets and Utilities committee on March 20<sup>th</sup>.

#### Bike Infrastructure

- City of Toledo gifted all the old Tolego Bike Racks to We Are Traffic to refurbish and use as bike parking throughout the City. A picture of a refurbished bike rack at the Toledo Farmers Market is attached.
- Inclusive Playgrounds/Exercise Equipment
  - Working with Ebeid Center and the ENP Health Equity Working Group to purchase exercise equipment for the park located next to Market on the Green.

- Will conduct community engagement to understand the needs and wants of the surrounding community.
- Working with the Ability Center to make sure all equipment is accessible.
- Hoping to have the equipment installed by end of summer.

#### Safe Routes to School

- Bike fix-it programs are being re-vamped and will become more of an Apprentice program. First day will consist of older kids learning to fix bikes and the second day they would help at bike-fix it as bike mechanics.
- Will be hosting a number of bike fix-it events. Volunteers needed. Jenny to send out more information.
- Submitted ODOT Infrastructure Grant for TPS to fund a number of projects.
- Bike to School Day is May 3<sup>rd</sup>. More to come.

#### ii. Healthy Eating

#### Produce Prescriptions

- Pilot ran from July 2022-December 2022 with Health Partners of Western Ohio patients.
- Served 28 patients and 103 household members
- 4 sites participated as voucher redemption sites: Seaway, Toledo Farmers Market (Downtown and Westgate Location) and Family Food Center.
- \$2,953.51 were redeemed in produce prescriptions.
- 0 \$1,003.51 worth of meal kit and produce boxes were delivered.
- Participating patients really enjoyed the program and felt the coupons were extremely helpful.

#### Healthy Food Access/Farmers Market/Corner Stores

- 0 Health Department plans to host FM this summer. More to come.
- 0 Junction Neighborhood is interested in having pop-up markets with the Bloom Garden.

#### Mobile Market Pilot

- 0 No more information on the Ebeid Center's Mobile Market.
- Toledo Northwestern Ohio Food Bank is in the process of receiving a Mobile Market that will be going to different identified sites.

#### Client Choice Food Pantry

- Working with the Caldwell Center to set up a client choice food pantry along with developing food service guidelines for donations.
- OSU extension is teaching nutrition classes at the Caldwell Center.
- In the process of planning a nutrition education series in the 8 different countries they serve.
  It will run from May- August and the mobile market will be present for participants to shop.
- May is Older American Month which will coincide with the kick-off at the Caldwell Center.

## Starting Fresh Diabetes and Chronic Disease

- 0 A free 5-week program ran by Mercy Health at the Franklin Medical Center
- 0 Healthy recipes, grocery shopping tips and produce pick-up twice during the 5-week program
- 0 Diabetic and other chronic disease self-management information.
- Last year distributed over 100 produce bags to starting participants.

#### Senior assessment/programming

- Survey for older adults 50+ living in Lucas County to gather input on how age-friendly our county is.

- Results of survey will be used by Area Office of Aging for applying for AARP's Age Friendly Designation Status.

- Additional Grants
  - i. REACH Grant (Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health)
    - A 5-year program aimed to improve health, prevent chronic disease, and reduce health disparities among racial and ethnic populations with the highest risk, or burden of chronic disease.
    - Three strategies: nutrition, physical activity plus one other option
    - 41 awards; approximately \$722,000/year
    - $\circ$  Will be reaching out for letters of support and/or information to use for the grant.
    - Due April 11, 2023
