VIII. Prior Business

- Ohio Department of Health is testing and monitoring wastewater for flu and COVID. Past trends show when flu and COVID cases have gone up, the wastewater has followed that trend line; wastewater is a leading indicator for disease in the population. Having infrastructure, we can consider what our response will be to help the community to prevent the spread of illness.
- All-Staff Retreat Agenda was provided.

IX. New Business/Points for Consideration

• Funds for Public Health in Lucas County 501(c)3 - All pretax returns for 2020, 2021, and 2022 have bene filed electronically.

X. Interim Health Commissioners Comments:

- Shannon M. Jones drew attention to the reports attached to the packet—divisional, commissioner, and disease investigations. These reports highlight what has been happening in the community and with the staff at Toledo-Lucas County Health Department (TLCHD).
- Rand Study Meeting took place October 16, 2023. Several sectors talked about health equity and well-being narratives. There will be another meeting in early spring.
- Jurisdictional Relations Shannon M. Jones reached out to the District Advisory Council
 to see if they are interested in hosting a flu clinic with TLCHD's help. The Merger
 Agreement passed by all jurisdictions including the City of Maumee.

- October 22-29 is Lead Safe Prevention Awareness Week. TLCHD has a setup in the lobby with educational information. Gloria Smith did a great job with lead prevention media interviews.
- Legislative Updates:
 - House Bill 257 introduced in August authorizing certain bodies to meet virtually. The Board of Health would be considered eligible with certain conditions met.
 - Joint 4 is proposing to enact Section 22 of Article 1 of the Constitution for the State
 of Ohio to protect individuals from being compelled to wear a mask or other facial
 coverings. AOHC has not taken a stance on this yet.
 - Senate Bill 144 amends ORC regarding immunizations administered by pharmacists, pharmacy internships, and pharmacy technicians. This will allow pharmacy technicians to immunize those 5 years and older. It also eliminates the prescription requirement for the person vaccinating children under the age of 13 and clarifies the application to immunizations to any disease including flu and COVID.

XI. Public Health in the News

• TLCHD will be providing RSV vaccinations for children in the near future.
